National Air Quality Awareness Week Continues New and improved APCD website — Sign up for air quality text alerts

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY, Calif. — For National Air Quality Awareness Week (May 3-7), Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) will provide information to learn more about our air quality.

Today, APCD will provide information about new tools and resources on our revamped website. <u>Yesterday, APCD provided an overview of where Santa Barbara County stands with certain pollutants.</u> All week, you can follow our social media (**@OurAirSBC** on Twitter and Instagram) for more resources.

APCD is excited to announce its revamped website, <u>www.OurAir.org</u>. Taking into account feedback from the public, APCD staff worked with local website design professionals to enhance popular features, add important new resources, and improve the overall look and navigational tools across desktop and mobile displays. A local photographer also captured images of Santa Barbara County's diverse landscapes to feature throughout the website. Below is a list of some of the other new elements:

Enhanced air quality data: www.OurAir.org/todays-air-quality

- In addition to providing hourly Air Quality Index (AQI) conditions for each permanent air quality monitoring station in the county, the website also displays a rolling 24 hours' worth of AQI conditions for every pollutant measured at each station.
- This page also shows the daily air quality forecast for different zones throughout the county, with projections for three days at a time.
- The website homepage now shows an at-a-glance summary of hourly air quality conditions.

Enhanced resources during wildfires:

- We wanted to provide a one-stop-shop webpage for smoke-related resources, for the next time wildfire smoke affects Santa Barbara County. A new splash page will take over the homepage during any future wildfires or other significant air quality incidents. The splash page will provide air quality data, considerations for protecting health, and links to related information.
- We also have expanded your options for receiving air quality alerts. In addition to being able to
 receive alerts via our email listserv, you can now sign up to receive text messages:

Enhanced accessibility:

• We have consistently provided bilingual news releases, air quality alerts, and other outreach materials. Now, many popular webpages are fully translated into Spanish and available in a dedicated, central location: https://www.OurAir.org/en-espanol/?lang=es
