SUBJECT: Old Car Buy Back Program

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Air Pollution Control Officer to increase the funding amount for the Old Car Buy Back Program by \$150,000 with the option of an additional \$100,000 increase if community interest justifies it.

SUMMARY:

The Santa Barbara Air Pollution Control District (APCD) has successfully implemented several Old Car Buy Back (OCBB) programs since the early 1990's with the most recent program approved by your Board on March 16, 2006. This latest program began retiring light-duty vehicles on May 1, 2006. There has been tremendous community interest in the program from the beginning and as of December 1, 2008 the APCD has retired 873 vehicles (averaging 28 cars/month), resulting in the reduction of almost 33 tons of ozone precursors (NOx + ROG), at a cost-effectiveness of \$9,653 per ton. Staff recommends that your Board authorize the Air Pollution Control Officer (APCO) to approve an additional program funding of \$250,000 (\$150,000 to start with an option for an additional \$100,000 if program interest justifies the funding increase). The current program budget of \$1,000,000 would be raised to \$1,250,000. This proactive measure is structured similar to the March 16, 2006, March 15, 2007, and May 15, 2008 Board actions. By obtaining additional funding allocations, this will ensure that the program continues service without interruption.

DISCUSSION:

The goal of an Old Car Buy Back program, also known as a Voluntary Accelerated Vehicle Retirement program, is to retire older, higher polluting vehicles prior to the end of their expected lifetime, thereby eliminating air pollution emissions associated with their operation. Real emission reductions can be achieved from this strictly voluntary program as the target vehicles are still fully operational and therefore have some useful life remaining. Vehicles meeting the eligibility requirements of the program must be retired by dismantling the vehicle to such a degree that the vehicle is rendered unusable.

On March 16, 2006 your Board approved a Grant Agreement with Environmental Engineering Studies (EES) to implement the Old Car Buy Back Program. The grant initially allocated to the program \$150,000 and gave the APCO the authority to increase the funding amount to \$250,000 if justified by demand. Approximately 100 vehicles were accepted within the first two weeks of the start of the program, and the APCO authorized the \$100,000 increase in program funding on May 15, 2006. On June 15, 2006 your Board authorized the APCO to increase the funding amount for the Old Car Buy Back Program by \$150,000 with the option of an additional \$100,000 increase if community interest in the program justified it. By the end of 2006, 357 vehicles had been retired. On January 2, 2007, the APCO authorized a \$100,000 program increase bringing the total program allocation to \$500,000.

Again on March 15, 2007, your Board authorized the APCO to increase the funding amount for the Old Car Buy Back Program by \$150,000 with the option of an additional \$100,000 increase if community interest in the program justified it. On April 27, 2007 the APCO increased funding by \$150,000 and then increased by \$100,000 on November 2, 2007.

Lastly, on May 15, 2008, your Board authorized the APCO to increase the funding amount for the Old Car Buy Back Program by \$150,000 with the option of an additional \$100,000 increase if community interest in the program justified it. On May 15, 2008 the APCO increased funding by \$150,000 and then increased by \$100,000 on December 3, 2008, as documented in an attached letter.

As of December 1, 2008 the APCD has retired 873 vehicles, resulting in the reduction of more than 37 tons of ozone precursors (NOx + ROG), with the average model year of 1983 at an average cost-effectiveness of \$7,986 per ton of NOx, ROG and PM reduced. Please refer to Table 1 and Figure 1 through Figure 3 for a summary of the program's performance as of December 1, 2008.

To ensure that the program continues service without interruption, staff recommends your board authorize the APCO to approve additional program funding of \$250,000 (\$150,000 to start and an option for an additional \$100,000 if program interest justifies the funding increase). This proactive measure is structured similar to the March 16, 2006, March 15, 2007, and May 15, 2008 Board actions and will bring the total funding allocation for this program to \$1,250,000. Any program funding increases will be authorized through written notice and the concurrence with the grantee, (e.g., Attachment 1), and will be included as an item in the subsequent Board meeting.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding and appropriations for this program are in the APCD FY08-09 budget, will be in the FY09-10 budget, and will come from either the Carl Moyer Program or the Department of Motor Vehicle surcharge fees.






Subject: Old Car Buyback Program Funding Increase (AP050613)

Dear Mr. Assioun:

The purpose of this letter is in response to continued community interest in the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District's (APCD) Old Car Buyback Program. As you are aware, the program, which officially began on May 1, 2006, has retired almost nine hundred eligible vehicles. The current program amount of \$900,000 will retire about 896 vehicles, and as we approach this number we would like to take proactive measures to ensure that the program is able to continue without interruptions due to delays in funding allocations.

Condition 3, <u>Grant Funding</u>, of Grant Agreement AP050613, dated March 16, 2006, between the APCD and Environmental Engineering Studies (EES) authorized the Air Pollution Control Officer (APCO), upon written notice and with your concurrence, to increase the grant funding from the original amount of \$150,000 up to \$250,000. Additional program funding increases were approved by the APCD Board on 6/15/06, and 3/15/07 that authorized the APCO to increase program funding based on community interest in a manner similar to that of the original grant. On May 15, 2008, the APCD Board approved a \$150,000 funding increase that raised the Old Car Buy Back program budget to \$900,000. An additional funding increase of \$100,000 is available at this time and based on community interest, I am extending the program budget to \$1,000,000.

Refer to Table 1 for a summary of the program budget increases and actions taken to date.
