Dear Ms. Gill:

The Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (District) has received your petition for exemption, dated June 25, 2010. This petition is for exemption from the National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) regulations for Paint Stripping and Miscellaneous Surface Coating Operations at Area Sources, contained in 40 CFR Part 63, Subpart HHHHHHH. Your petition concerns the business (101 Collision) located at 606 E. Haley Street in Santa Barbara.

To obtain an exemption, 40 CFR Section 63.11170(a)(2) requires that as the owner or operator of a motor vehicle surface coating operation you demonstrate, to the District's satisfaction, that you spray apply no coatings that contain target Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs), as defined in Section 63.11180. The petition must include a description of the coatings that you spray apply and your certification that you do not spray apply any coatings containing the target HAPs.

Based upon the information provided in your petition for the facility referenced above and your signed certification that none of the coatings sprayed at the facility contain the target HAPs, the District has determined that the facility is exempt from Subpart HHHHHHH requirements for its spray applied coating activities.

Note that this exemption applies only to spray-applied coating activities. If the facility performs other activities subject to Subpart HHHHHHH, such as paint stripping using methylene chloride (MeCl), then the facility would still need to comply with applicable provisions of Subpart HHHHHH, including the requirement for submission of an initial notification letter describing those activities.

You are required to maintain a record of this exemption on site at the facility for as long as you perform motor vehicle and mobile equipment surface coating operations. If circumstances change such that you intend to spray apply coatings containing any target HAP, the owner or operator must submit the initial notification required by Section 63.11175 and comply with the requirements of this subpart.

This exemption is based on information that you have provided to us. Nothing in this exemption shall be construed as limiting the ability of the EPA or the District to pursue enforcement action, if it is determined that your facility was not eligible for this exemption or for any other violations under the Clean Air Act.
