#### New Source Review Revisions

- Current Rules Adopted 1997
- Pre-Construction Permitting Program
- New Sources or Modifications to Existing Sources
- Drafts Reviewed by ARB and EPA
- Public Workshops Held in Santa Barbara and Santa Maria
- Council Meetings start in December
- To Board Spring 2016



#### Greenhouse Gas Credits

- A bank for local reduction projects
- Credit for real reductions beyond what is required
- Public Workshop/s early 2016
- Council Meeting/s Mid 2016
- Board Mid-Late 2016



#### Boilers, Water Heaters and Process Heaters

- Update to existing rule
- Measure Proposed in 2013 Clean Air Plan
- Applies to small units that are usually exempt from permit
- Requires certification at point of sale
- Begin review process in early 2016



# Clean Air Plan Update

- Plan to Attain the State Ozone Standard
- Updated Every 3 years
- Air Quality Data
- Emission Inventory
- Control Measures
- Transportation Control Measures



## Clean Air Plan Update

- Usually at Least 3-4 Council Meetings
  - Proposed Control Measures
  - Air Quality, Emission Inventory, and Transportation
  - Wrap-up and Review Changes
- To Board after final Council Meeting



# Rule Development

- Potential rules are identified by Plan control measures
- Tentative list posted each January
- Draft Prepared by Staff
- EPA/ARB Review
- Public workshops
- Council review
- Board adoption



### Rule Development

- California Clean Air Act "Every Feasible Measure"
- Cost Effectiveness
- Technological Feasibility
- Emission Reduction Potential
- Rate of Reduction
- Public Acceptability
- Enforceability



#### Council Role

- Advise the APCO and Board
- Planning and Rulemaking Issues
- Consider
  - Public Health
  - Economy
  - Costs
  - Local, State, Federal Laws
