- b) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) relating to the SDRMA's health benefits program.

D-8) Approval of Second Amendment to Contract for Legal Services on Bankruptcy Matters

Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Second Amendment to the Agreement for Professional Legal Services with Snow Spence Green LLP to increase the not to exceed amount from \$15,000 to \$35,000.

D-9) Facility Use Agreement for Santa Barbara Monitoring Station

Consider recommendations as follows:

- a) Authorize the Air Pollution Control Officer to execute a Facility Use Agreement between the Santa Barbara Unified School District (SBUSD) and the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (District) for the purpose of maintaining an air monitoring station at the former Santa Barbara Armory site (Armory site); and
- b) Delegate Authority to the Air Pollution Control Officer to renegotiate the agreement terms for an additional year, pursuant to Section 4 of the Agreement.

D-10) Woodsmoke Reduction Program

Consider recommendations as follows:

- a) Delegate authority to the Air Pollution Control Officer (Control Officer) to sign a grant agreement with the California Air Resources Board similar to the attached model draft grant subject to review and approval by District Counsel, Risk Management and Auditor-Controller and to receive up to \$150,000 in grant funding for the Woodsmoke Reduction Program;
- Delegate authority to the Control Officer to execute installer agreements with participating installers subject to review and approval by District Counsel, Auditor and Risk Management and all other necessary documents to implement the program; and
- c) Adopt a Resolution delegating such authority to the Control Officer.
