

## CARL MOYER STATE RESERVE (YEAR 24)

- CARB funds to replace gasoline/diesel landscaping equipment with electric equipment for landscaping businesses, schools, public agencies, and non-profits
- Full program guidelines developed by CARB to be released this summer
- \$850,000 to be liquidated within four years
  - Equipment funds: \$743,750
  - Administration funds: \$106,250




- A successful project will be eligible to receive a grant within a range from \$10,000 to \$250,000.
