

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Major Accomplishments for FY 2022-23

- Completed installation & commissioning of Santa Maria air monitoring station
- Completed the Clean Air Rooms Pilot Program
 - Distributed 800 free HEPA air purifiers to individuals in Guadalupe & Casmalia
- Increased District's internal Bilingual Team
 - > 7 certified individuals = 17.5% of the District's workforce
- Performance Numbers in CY 2022:
 - > 457 permitting actions
 - > 656 inspections
 - Responded to 324 air pollution complaints
 - Responded to 121 PRA requests
- Executed \$4.5 million in clean air grant contracts
 - Disbursed \$1.7 million in award funding
 - > 32 Clean Air Grant projects became operational in FY 22-23

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




Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget Overview

- Balanced budget
- FY 2023-24 Proposed Budget \$19,637,884
 - Operating budget \$10,258,254
- Overall budget increase of 10% (\$1,815,366)
 - Largely due to pass-through and fixed assets
- FY 2023-24 Staffing: 34 FTE





Factors Affecting This Year's Budget

On-going Pass-Through Grant Fund Revenue

- > \$9.3 million for local voluntary emission reduction projects:
 - > \$2.8 million new funds and \$6.5 million of prior year grant fund balance
- \$327,186 in administrative funds to implement grant projects

Fee Revenues

April to April CPI increase of 7.7%


One-time Expenditures

- Fully renovate the McCoy property office building and bring it up to the District's standards
 - ▶ This space will house the District's north county staff, our fleet, conference space for public workshops & fully equipped monitoring lab
 - Resiliency is our focus that includes sustainable building practices, with a goal of being a net-zero energy-efficient building




Operating Revenue Plan






Operating Expenditure Characterization
