Topic: Variance Petition and Variance Order Forms	
Distribution: <u>All Policy Holders</u>	

In order to apply for a variance, the source must complete a <u>Petition for Variance</u> (see Attachment 1). This is a six page form with a three page instruction sheet. It incorporates the requirements of the 1991 Health and Safety Code and APCD rules 503 and 504. This form replaces all existing variance application forms.

When the Hearing Board grants a variance, APCD staff must prepare a variance order which details the findings made by the Hearing Board as well as any conditions imposed. Attachments 2, 3 and 4 are boilerplate variance order forms for the following purposes:

- Attachment 2. Variance order form for <u>Interim, 90-Day and Regular</u> Variances.
- Attachment 3. Variance order form for <u>non-breakdown</u> related Emergency Variances.
- Attachment 4. Variance order form for <u>Emergency</u> Variances filed <u>pursuant to Rule 506 (Breakdowns)</u>.

The only difference in Attachments 3 and 4 is that Rule 506.B requires four additional findings in addition to those required by the Health and Safety Code.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING VARIANCE PETITIONS

A variance is an administrative order issued by the Air Pollution Control District Hearing Board granting temporary relief from the provisions of a District Rule and Regulation, ATC/PTO permit condition or section of the California Health and Safety Code. A variance will allow you to continue operating while taking steps to achieve compliance. However, the California Health and Safety Code prohibits the granting of a variance from the requirement to obtain an Authority to Construct permit (Rule 201.A) and for public nuisance (Rule 303).

There are four types of variances that you may apply for: Emergency, Interim, 90-Day and Regular. You should apply for an Emergency Variance if you find yourself out of compliance without any warning and the time to correct the problem will not exceed 15 days (in certain circumstances, this can be extended to 30 days). Otherwise, if you will be out of compliance for less than 90 days, then you should apply for a 90-Day Variance. If the time needed to achieve compliance is greater than 90 days, then you should apply for a Regular Variance. In certain instances, when you file for either a 90-Day or Regular Variance, you may also need an Interim Variance. A separate petition must be filed for each type of variance requested. Thus, if you need an Interim and a 90-Day Variance, two separate petitions must be submitted.

In order for the Hearing Board to grant any variance, Section 42352 of the 1991 California Health and Safety Code requires the Hearing Board to make six "findings" which are summarized as questions # 5 through 10 of the petition form. Please be aware that it is your responsibility, as the petitioner, to provide the Hearing Board with adequate information such that the Hearing Board can make these findings. Thus, the answers to questions # 5 through 10 must be as complete and thorough as possible.

There are fees associated with each type of variance petition. Please contact the District to determine the amount of the fee which must be submitted along with your petition.

Emergency Variance petitions are to be filed at the District's Buellton, Santa Maria or Goleta offices during normal business hours. Only the original copy of the petition is required, along with the filing fee.

For Interim, 90-Day and Regular Variances, the original petition and twelve copies and the filing fee are to be filed with the Clerk of the Hearing Board, 105 East Anapamu Street, Room 407, Santa Barbara during normal business hours. At the same time, a separate copy of the petition must be filed at the District's Goleta office.

Specific directions for completing each question in the variance petition form are provided below. If you need more space than is provided in the petition form to answer the questions, you may attach additional information on separate sheets of paper.

PETITION QUESTION

- 1.A Indicate your business name, phone number and address.
- 1.B This section should only be completed if the person who should receive correspondence regarding this variance petition is different from the petitioner. For example, the petitioner may be Acme Tire Company of San Francisco. However, Acme has a branch office in Santa Barbara and wants the manager of that office to work with the District to process the petition. In this situation, the name, address and phone number of the manager would be provided as a response to this question.
- 1.C District Rule 503.B requires this information to be provided. An example of "other entity" would be a governmental agency.
- 2. List the address of the equipment for which the variance is desired. If a street address is not readily available, please provide a brief description of the location - e.g., two miles east of the intersection of Main Street and Adams Avenue in Santa Royale.
- 3. List the equipment, equipment ID number (if any) and the District ATC or PTO permit number(s) for the equipment.
- 4. This section is only to be completed if you have reported a breakdown condition at your facility pursuant to District Rule 505 and you are applying for an Emergency Variance pursuant to District Rule 506.
- 5A. You may or will be in violation of more than one District Rule and Regulation, ATC/PTO permit condition or section of the Health and Safety Code. Please list all applicable ones.
- 5B. The harm or damage which would result may also be economic in nature.
- 6A. Provide a brief description of why the equipment is or will be in violation. For example, "the PTO requires my boiler to use utility grade natural gas. The gas company has curtailed delivery of natural gas because of shortages due

to the cold weather. Consequently I have to burn fuel oil".

- 6B. In order for the Hearing Board to grant a variance, one of the most important findings that it must make is that the conditions which have caused or will cause you to be in violation are beyond your reasonable control. For this item, you need to provide adequate evidence that the cause of the non-compliance is beyond your reasonable control. Thus, for the example provided in Question #6 (above), the curtailment of natural gas by the utility company is beyond the reasonable control of the petitioner. However, if the utility company has refused to deliver natural gas because you forgot to pay your gas bill, this situation may not have been beyond your reasonable control.
- 7. In granting a variance, the Hearing Board must also balance the public interest of not requiring you to comply with District Rules and Regulations against your staying in business. To answer this question, you should state the benefits associated with your continued operation. These benefits may be economic or social in nature.
- 8. You should state whether you have considered curtailing operations. If you have decided not to curtail operations, please state why you have decided against doing so.
- 9. If the variance will result in emissions greater than allowed by District Rules and Regulations or a permit condition, please describe how these excess emissions will be minimized.
- 10. If the granting of your variance will not result in air pollutant emissions over any limits specified by your permit or District Rules and Regulations, please state this fact.
- 11. As appropriate, include copies of purchase orders for equipment or services or other documentation.
- 12. Section 42353 of the California Health and Safety Code prohibits the Hearing Board from granting a variance if the operation of the equipment for which the variance is sought would constitute a nuisance.
- 13. District Rule 504.H requires this information to be provided.
